

Current/upcoming construction activities

Main civil works contractor mobilization and earthworks

- The MCW contractor continues to mobilize to the dam site area. This includes the preparation
 of a parking lot, laydown and stockpile areas, survey work and site investigations. Earthworks
 and excavation is expected to begin.
- Continued construction of the worker accommodation lodge.
- Excavation and road construction on north bank and excavation in and around the Peace River.
- The extension of an existing distribution line on Old Fort Road.
- Clearing on the south bank and upgrades to access roads. Road maintenance activities will continue on the petroleum development roads.
- Work will occur to construct the temporary substation and distribution lines on the south bank.
- Dikes will be constructed on the south bank back channel in preparation to dewater the channel.
- Continued operations at Wuthrich Quarry.
- MOTI's contractor is working on 240 and Old Fort roads.
- Geotechnical investigations will continue along Highway 29 at Cache Creek/Bear Flat.
- Site-wide erosion and sediment measures will continue to be implemented.



Reporting requirements

Monthly reporting requirements for major contractors

- Companies awarded the contracts to build Site C are responsible for hiring their workers.
- BC Hydro requires major contractors to report regularly on workforce demographics.
- Typically, monthly workforce reports include:
 - Total number of workers
 - Workers from PRRD, B.C. and the rest of Canada
 - Aboriginal workers
 - Apprentices
 - Temporary Foreign Workers

- Peak of 691 workers to date; 492 from B.C.; rest from Canada.
