Students must:

- O Enroll full-time in an eligible program at Northern Lights College
- O Demonstrate residency in northeast B.C.
- O Demonstrate financial need
- O Demonstrate Indigenous ancestry, e.g. name of Indigenous community of origin and self-declaration of Indigenous status

50% of the award will provided after the student has registered and successfully completed the first week of classes. The remaining 50% will be provided mid-way through the program, after the student has demonstrated academic achievement.

- Interested students can apply by providing a cover letter that describes education and work experience, financial need, career and educational goals, and any volunteer or community involvement.
