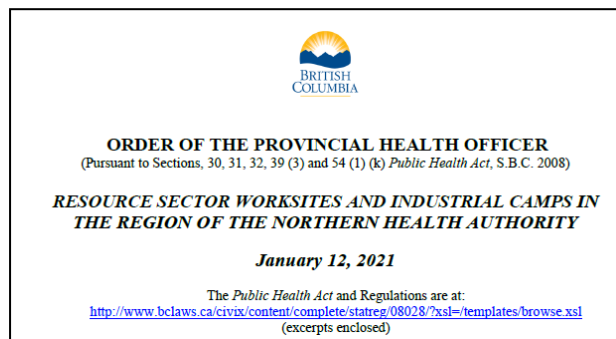

WORKERS ACCESSING THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

As you are aware, on January 13, the Provincial Health Officer posted a new Industrial camp order that affects our site. This new order is effective January 12th and restricts camp workers from leaving site during their work rotation.

Thank you to everyone who has restricted their visits up until now, as requested. However, due to the rapid increase in cases of COVID-19 associated with industrial projects in the Northern Health Authority region, and the challenges that public health officials have in responding to these cases, clusters and outbreaks at remote worksites and industrial camps, the provincial health office now *requires* compliance.



*The Provincial Health Office now requires individuals staying in camp, to **remain in camp** during their entire shift rotation*

As of Wednesday January 20, 2021, the following process will apply and remain in place for the duration of the Provincial Health Order

Camp Workers: Any worker staying in camp will have their site access card deactivated after arrival at site; and the card will be reactivated for departure at the end of their rotation. Any camp worker leaving site during their rotation will be told that, unless they have an exemption as defined below, they will not be allowed to access site upon their return.

For the time being, BC Hydro will also be discontinuing the “wrist band” program, and all individuals accessing site will need to answer screening questions each time they return to site. We ask that local workers only enter and exit site once per day, unless there is a work-related reason. **This excludes shuttle drivers.**

*Contractors are responsible for monitoring and determining **exemptions for their workers**. As per the Health Order, exemptions will only be for work related functions, medical emergencies and critical appointments Contractor’s will grant exemptions in advance of leaving site.*

Individuals breaching provincial health orders, are subject to having have their site access privileges revoked.

We understand that this may cause some disruption to everyone, camp workers, locals and commuters that stay in town. Please remember that to keep the project moving forward, **we need you all working healthy and safe.**

Remember stay home if you start to feel ill, even if symptoms are mild. If in camp, stay in your room and call the ISOS clinic at 778-844-0281.
